	☐ Avoid standing water in plant containers
	☐ Increase air movement by opening doors and/or windows
Pests	☐ Clean all food crumbs and spills right away
	☐ Store food in sealed containers
Cockroaches and rodents secretions, droppings, and body parts can worsen asthma. These pests are	☐ Remove food, bags, newspaper, cans, bottles, and empty boxes from the sleeping area
often found in areas with food and water such as kitchens, bathrooms, and basements.	☐ Put all garbage in plastic trash bags. Seal trash bags and put them into garbage cans with fitted lids every day
	$\hfill \square$ Seal holes and gaps between construction materials and pipes
	☐ Clean all surfaces where you have seen pests. Use poison baits, boric acid or traps to kill pests
	☐ Minimize the use of sprays. When spraying ensure the patient is not in the room, and make sure there is plenty of fresh air
	☐ Increase air movement by opening doors and/or windows

Smoking	☐ Keep the home and car smoke-free. Do not allow anyone to smoke in the
	home or car
	☐ Do not use a wood-burning stove, kerosene heater, unvented gas

Warm-blooded Pets (such as cats and dogs)	☐ Remove pets with fur or feathers from the home or keep them outside
	☐ If this is not possible, keep the pet out of the bedroom, and keep the bedroom door closed
	☐ Remove carpets and furniture covered with cloth from your home. If this is not possible, keep the pet out of the rooms where these are
